Headlines

Dear Parents/Carers

Thank you to parents who were able to attend one of the Year group information evenings that have been held over the past few weeks, we hope that they were informative and useful. Yesterday, Mrs Yates, Head of MFL Faculty, and I had the pleasure of attending the national launch of the Language Hub programme. There are only nine schools nationally who have been selected to lead this programme. We look forward to moving on with this programme once they have appointed the national Centre of Excellence.

I would like to congratulate Lottie Mills, Year 13 on being shortlisted for the BBC Young Writers Award. This is an exceptional achievement. More information can be found later in PressTales. If you are interested, the award ceremony is live on BBC Radio 4 on Tuesday 2nd from around 6.45pm, with the winner being announced at 7.45pm. It is an achievement to be shortlisted, but we are still rooting for Lottie to win the first prize!

I was contacted by a parent last week who gave me some lovely news about four of our students. On their way home, they saw an elderly gentleman who seemed to be struggling to walk and breath. They checked he was ok, then went to his house nearby and got his wife; who in turn got in her car and went to pick up the gentlemen. So often teenagers get a bad press, this was an act of real kindness from the girls – well done to them all.

You may have heard that we have stopped providing disposable plastic cups, cutlery, pots, lids and containers in the canteen. Instead, we are using washable plates, metal cutlery and compostable pots. This change has resulted in an expected saving of nearly £8,500 for the year ahead. It is also going to have a positive effect on the environment, as normally we use 150,000 cups, 47,000 chip trays, 36,000 salad containers, 60,000 pieces of cutlery and 5000 burger boxes in one year. We would encourage you to purchase a reusable water bottle for your child to use in school.

You will have seen in the press today that many headteachers are marching on Downing Street in protest at the continuing funding crisis facing all schools. Whilst the government continue to state that funding is at an all-time high, they are choosing not to admit that there have been significant increases in costs through the back door. As funding is based on student numbers, the increases in funding are also due to there being more children in the system. As I was in London yesterday for the Language Hub launch, I chose not to attend today as I didn't want to be out of school again. However, I fully support the actions of those headteachers who are in London today and hope that the government quickly address the issues that are being raised.





Canoe Slalom

New to our Sixth Form this year is Team GB Junior Canoe Slalom paddler, Ellis Miller. Ellis typically trains 12 times per week at Lee Valley White Water Centre

following the legacy of the London Olympics. This summer, having qualified for Team GB U18 through a selection series of races, she competed at the U23 and Junior Canoe Slalom World Championships in Ivrea, Italy and in the C1W Team event won a World Silver Medal. Individually, Ellis qualified through heats to the semi-final, finishing 26th. At the equivalent European Championships in Bratislava, Ellis individually performed well, this time making it through heats and the semi-final to qualify for her first major championship final, finishing 10th. The summer also saw Ellis gain Senior GB experience, competing in World Cup events in Augsburg, Germany, 34th place, and a really strong performance at Tacen, Slovenia, 7th place. More recently, Ellis performed incredibly well at the British Open two weekends ago against the best paddlers this country has to offer and also against several international guests. Ellis took advantage of the fact the Senior GB Team of 3 were in Rio preparing for the currently occurring Senior World Championships, and won not only the U16 title, but also the U18, U23 and Senior titles simultaneously. This is a tremendous achievement at only 16 years of age and we look forward to seeing how she progresses over the next two years.
