

Year 9 German Curriculum



In Year 9 you will build on the language (vocabulary and grammar) you have learnt in Year 8 by continuing to develop listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in the topic areas listed below. As part of the course, your increasing knowledge of the cultural life in Germany, Austria and Switzerland will give you a better understanding of how people live there.

You will be working towards being able to complete the following skills:

- **In Listening & Reading:** Understanding key classroom commands, recognising the present and the immediate future tenses, understanding longer passages containing opinions and justifications with both familiar and unfamiliar language from authentic sources.
- **In Speaking & Writing:** Responding to a range of questions including the present and immediate future tense, developing longer answers/sentences using connectives and time phrases and including descriptions, opinions and justifications.
- **Translation:** Translating familiar sentences and short paragraphs into both German and English.
- **Pronunciation:** Developing the accuracy of pronunciation and intonation.

You will explore the following **key topics**:

Holiday destinations, buying snacks and souvenirs, holiday plans, talking about a past holiday, how you travelled, the weather and problems, asking for directions, what you watch when you have screen time (TV, film and books) and opinions, daily routine, food and drink and a healthy lifestyle, school trips.

You will come across the following **cultural aspects** throughout the year:
German holiday destinations, National holidays and festivals (Christmas, Easter, Karneval), German TV and music, Traditional German food and drink

You will practise the following **grammar points** throughout the year:

Adjectival endings
Present tense/future tense verbs
Perfect tense with haben and sein
Modal verbs
Word order with conjunctions
Prepositions 'in' and 'auf'
Reflexive verbs
