

Year 9 Spanish Curriculum



In Year 9 you will build on the language (vocabulary and grammar) you have learnt in Year 8 by continuing to develop listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in the topic areas listed below. As part of the course, your increasing knowledge of the cultural life in Spain and Spanish-speaking countries will give you a better understanding of how people live there.

You will be working towards being able to complete the following skills:

- **In Listening & Reading:** Understanding key classroom commands, recognising the present and the immediate future tenses, understanding longer passages containing opinions and justifications with both familiar and unfamiliar language from authentic sources.
- **In Speaking & Writing:** Responding to a range of questions including the present and immediate future tense, developing longer answers/sentences using connectives and time phrases and including descriptions, opinions and justifications.
- **Translation:** Translating familiar sentences and short paragraphs into both Spanish and English.
- **Pronunciation:** Developing the accuracy of pronunciation and intonation.

You will explore the following **key topics**:

Description of appearance and personality, relationships and helping at home, arranging an outing, future plans, daily routine, holidays, time (24 hour clock), modes of transport, tourism in Madrid

You will come across the following **cultural aspects** throughout the year:

- *National holidays and festivals (Christmas, Easter, Carneval)*
- *Spanish music*
- *Spanish film*
- *Languages of Spain & the Spanish-speaking world*

You will practise the following **grammar points** throughout the year:

- *Uses of ser and estar*
- *Present tense/future tense verb revision*
- *Preterite (past) tense*
- *Imperfect (past) tense*
- *Introduction to reflexive verbs*
- *Expressions with the infinitive*
