An occasional dip into the archives

Presdales School, previously Ware Grammar School for Girls, has a rich history. We are fortunate enough to still have a number of items in our archives which make for an interesting read. As part of an occasional dip into the archives, I have looked at some things that were going on a hundred years ago.

Earlier this school year Predales introduced a house system. This has been very successful with many students and staff taking part in house events and competitions.

From its earliest days Ware Grammar School had four houses, Broxbourne, Hertford, Ware and Et Cetera. Et Cetera was eventually renamed County.

The archives show the house system was very competitive, with regular inter house tennis, netball, badminton and gymnastics competitions. The inter house rivalry didn't stop there. At the end of each term, pupils were given a text to read over the holidays. This was examined the first day back with points being allocated for accuracy. There are also references to needlework, drawing, singing and wild flower collecting competitions. Perhaps the strangest one was a weeding competition held in autumn 1919. One way to tidy the garden before winter!

News from Languages

Languages are alive and very well at Presdales!



6th Form Language Prefects

Last week the BBC reported the results of their survey into Language Learning and uptake at GCSE, A Level and beyond. Sadly, these headlines painted a very negative picture of language teaching and provision across the UK. However, at Presdales, we can proudly say that this not the case. All of our students learn French and another language from a choice of German, Italian, Russian and Spanish from Year 7 to 9. No other secondary school in the area has so many languages on offer. The vast majority of our



girls study at least one language at GCSE with commendable success. We have 82 girls in the sixth form studying a language and 15 of these are dual linguists. These are incredible numbers, especially in the light of current national trends.

Why is Presdales bucking the trend?

Put simply, we have a whole school commitment to language learning for all abilities. In our language department we have 16 specialist teachers and 5 assistants with over 300 years of experience between them! Together, we seek to inspire an enthusiasm for language learning on a daily basis. Our language classrooms are lively and purposeful with a 'can do' atmosphere. We present, practise and embed new language in many different ways to appeal and maximise the potential of all our learners, whatever their ability. It is a myth that only the 'gifted' can learn a language. We did after all manage to learn our own! The context of each language's culture is immensely important and we celebrate their cultural diversity. Our students benefit enormously from the impressive number and variety of trips across all languages to France, Germany, Italy, Russia and Spain. Our students are encouraged to go to clubs to try out new languages, compete in national competitions and in-house competitions during the European Week of Languages and the Lingofest.

What is our future?

Our future looks exciting! We are delighted to have been **selected as one of nine schools nationally to lead a Modern Languages Hub by the DfE**. Over the next two years, Presdales will be playing a key role in the government's solution to the current decline in languages. **We will be working under the guidance of the National Centre for Excellence for Language Pedagogy (NCELP) based at the University of York** and we are now linked to 4 local schools to form the Hub, all working to deliver excellent language teaching.



Specialists will be trained by NCELP and will then share their research-based training with the link schools so that, in total, 45 schools across the country will be poised to cascade excellent language practices nationwide.

Consequently, our students at Presdales will have access to the best available language teaching pedagogy and excellent resources leading to even more success and enjoyment.

At Presdales, we recognise that speaking English is not enough and that language learning is also about embracing other cultures, gaining a broad range of transferable skills that are so valued by employers and universities, whilst also enjoying and reflecting on our own national and cultural identity. Studies suggest that speaking another language distinguishes you in the workplace from others with similar qualifications and experience, will lead to higher pay, better job prospects abroad and even improve brain function.

We need to spread the word! Perhaps we, as a society, need to rethink our attitude to language learning. People in the UK are as good as anyone else at learning languages if we want to and Presdales students are a testament to this. Language learning is useful, lots of fun and healthy for everyone at every age.

UK Intermediate Mathematics Challenge 2019

This is a higher percentage than last year receiving certificates, despite the greater numbers entering.

Additionally, four students have been invited to take part in the follow-on round called the Intermediate Kangaroo competition that is inspired by the Australian Mathematics Trust. The qualifiers for this competition are Rebecca Fletcher, Leanna Rhodes and Sara Qureshi in Year 11, plus Iona Dixon in Year 10. It is the third year in a row that Rebecca Fletcher has been invited to take part in this extra challenge and the second time for Sara Qureshi.

Congratulations to all who took part and had the resilience to think outside the box for this 1 hour individual challenge.

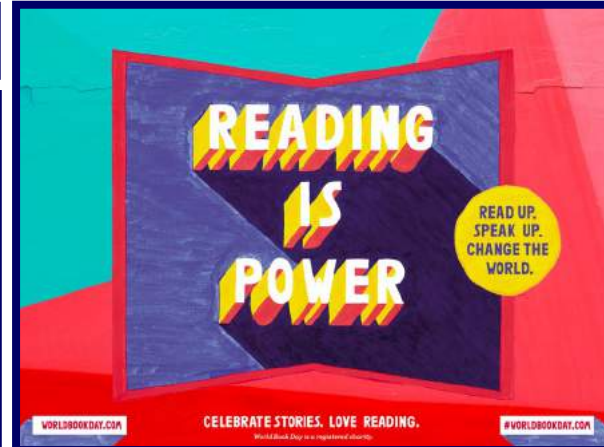

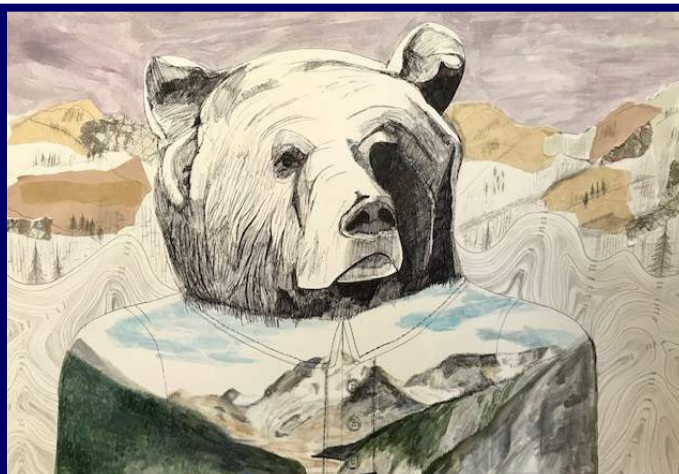

Tomorrow's Engineers EEP Robotics Challenge

On the 13th February, we attended the Tomorrow's Engineers Robotic Challenge at RAF Hendon. We had been building robots over the previous months and preparing presentations.

Our first challenge was the speed challenge where we had to make the robot go as fast as it can in 4m. On our first run it managed to do it in two seconds which placed us second. Unfortunately, the other teams had improved since the first run, so we ended up placing 5th. However, it was very close as the top team had a time of 1.76.

Then we began to prepare for the mat challenge. For this we had to make and program a robot that can complete many challenges. For example, carry a box and go up a cardboard ramp. On our first try we managed to complete almost all the challenges. We quickly went back to base and began preparing for our research project.

We had to research and design a robot that would help the world. We chose a robot doctor controlled by a suit which would help in a humanitarian crisis. The presentation went well, and we got the judges laughing which is always a good sign. There was also a teamwork challenge which tested our communication and ability as a team. The judges didn't give anything away on how well we did. We then made a few adjustments on our challenge robot hoping to complete all the challenges. We had a quick re-program and we were on our way. We managed to complete a few more challenges which was a good improvement.

The final thing we had to do was talk about our robot design and the improvements we made. This was easy as we were very proud of what we designed and built. Despite our efforts, we didn't make it through in the top teams but we weren't disheartened and still love our robots.
