Dear Parents/Carers

As we reach the end of this half term I would like to take this opportunity to thank our staff for the extra time and effort they have given to prepare our Year 11 and 13 students for their exams. Extra revision classes have been running before school, at lunchtimes and after school throughout the year. Thank you also to all parents and carers for their support. The exams have started well and we are confident that the students will receive the grades that they deserve.

Friday 17th May was the last day for Year 13. Instrumental Lessons 2019

Regrettably, the charges for instrumental lessons in school will be increased with effect from September 2019.

This is because Hertfordshire Music Service has increased their hourly charge to the school and we have no choice but to pass this cost on to parents/carers.

The new prices from September are as follows:

11 x 30 min lessons	£233.00
11 x 15 min lessons	£116.50 (No longer available, for existing pupils only)
11 x 20 min lessons	£155.00

We hope children will continue lessons but please be reminded that a full half-term's notice in writing will be required if you wish to discontinue lessons. This should be sent in writing to the school or by email to finance@presdales.herts.sch.uk.

We shall still give a subsidy for GCSE and A level pupils but this will be based on good attendance at extra-curricular activities and at concerts.

Students receiving free school meals or certain other benefits may be able to receive financial support for instrumental or vocal lessons with Hertfordshire Music Service.

EduFundUK

With funding in schools tight, Presdales is incredibly grateful to the Hertfordshire based charity, EduFundUK, for their support of our recent grant applications.

This term, with their support, Year 12 boys benefited from a motivation and goal setting workshop delivered by professional adventurer, explorer, educator and speaker, Justin Mills.

Year 10 students attended half day sessions run by Glia Learning, focusing on developing effective study habits, which received positive feedback from the students. In support of this programme, parents were invited to attend a further session in the evening. Excellent parental commitment to the students was demonstrated by a strong attendance.

A whole year maths based programme, Brain Blaster, from the Happy Puzzle Company, is in the process of being booked.

Funds have also extended to include the purchase of equipment that supports a diverse range of activities at Presdales. Running for a couple of years now, our Robotics Club has been restricted in its achievements due to limited equipment. Guided by new competition specifications, additional kit has been purchased to increase the range of possible designs. We look forward to this club going from strength to strength.

Another STEM activity run recently was the hatching and rearing of four ducklings who are now enjoying life with two student families. The equipment for this was obtained through a rental deal. Following this successful Science programme, that also had an amazing effect on wellbeing across the whole school, EduFundUK's support has now enabled us to purchase kit to be able to repeat this on regular basis.

Finally, an application for money to purchase new "crash mats" for PE was successful and three new mats are being purchased that will support the areas of gymnastics, trampolining and dance.

Presdales School wishes to say a huge "THANK YOU" to EduFundUK for making all of this possible.

Routes into Languages - Unplanned directions!!!

We have started a new tradition in the Languages Department! Once a term our sixth formers eat lunch together with their language teachers, assistants and any other like minded language lovers. We discuss 'linguistic matters'!! Earlier this month a group of Year 12 and 13 linguists were really inspired by 2 of our Alumni who returned to Presdales to talk to us about the challenges of learning languages at A Level and how they were so very pleased to have taken that route.

Lissy Moncur Byrne completed her A Levels 2 years ago. She studied Russian, German and History at Presdales but did not feel ready to go on to University. She deferred her place to study Law at the University of York and took a gap year which she spent as an Au Pair in Berlin. She is now in her second year of Law studies and confesses that she spends most of her holidays in Berlin visiting the friends and places she got to know in her year abroad. Lissy is considering doing a work placement in Germany as part of her Law training.

Izzy Watson studied French, Politics and Geography at A Level and is in her first year at Reading University. She is studying International Relations and Spanish which she has started ab initio! Izzy would be the first to say that A Level French was difficult in the early stages and she found the jump from GCSE to A Level demanding. She worked very hard and achieved an A grade which gave her the confidence to begin a new language. Izzy firmly believes that her French teachers gave her the skills to learn other languages and is looking forward to spending a year in Seville, Bilbao or Madrid as part of her degree.

It was lovely to catch up with these 2 young ladies and our students asked lots of questions about what was possible at university. Many were surprised that university and life experiences can take you down a very different path to what you might have imagined, when you choose you're A Levels at 16. Some of our students were thinking carefully about how they could combine their language studies with a variety of other subjects.

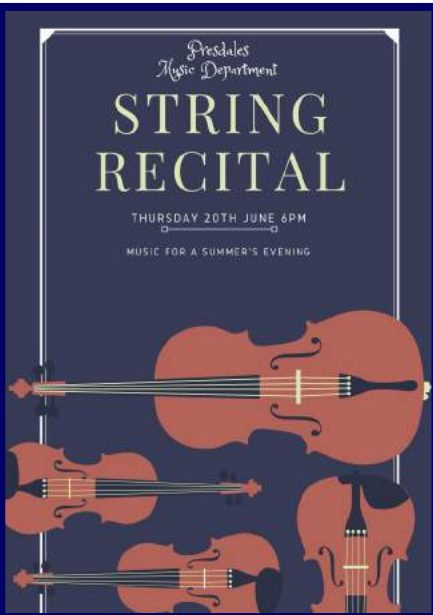
