What is the Feria de Sevilla

- It is a Spanish festival normally celebrated in April but was cancelled this year due to corona virus
- It lasts for 6 days
- One year 5,000,000 people attended
- The Seville Fair is held in the Andalusian capital of Seville, Spain. The fair generally begins two weeks after the Semana Santa, or Easter Holy Week. The fair officially begins at midnight on Saturday, and runs seven days, ending on the following Saturday

What happens at the festival

- Every day they start the day with a parade of carriges and riders
- At midday they walk up and meet bull fighters and breeders
- They end the festival with a big firework ceremony to celebrate the end of the Feria de Sevilla



Typical food and drink that you would have there

- Eating and Drinking is at the heart of Seville's festival. The festival officially kicks off when thousands of multi-coloured light bulbs flicker into life and illuminate the festival. Known as the 'Alumbrado' by this time, people have already had the "Pescaíto Dinner".
- This mouth-watering meal includes fried prawns, baby squids, red mullets, clams and other delicious freshly caught seafood.

What to wear to the festival

- Feria is the pinnacle of pijo culture – women will don the traditional traje de gitana, a tight, ruffled dress that cost upwards of 500€. ... If you're a chico, wear a suit and tie. Caseta etiquette is very important, and you'll be expected to follow suit
