

## *River Loire, Southern Auvergne*

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*How would you travel there?*

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You could travel there in the car to Folkstone in England, and then take the Eurotunnel to Calais in France. The journey takes around 9 hours so it would be best to travel overnight.



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*Where would you stay?*

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You could stay in a campsite called Cosy-Camp located on the banks of the River Loire. This campsite is family friendly and has a variety of different accommodation options. You could choose to bring your own tent or stay in the range of different cabins. At Cosy-Camp, there are no cars so it is safe for young children. Cosy-Camp also includes 2 outdoor, heated swimming pools and a smaller 15m<sup>2</sup> heated pool.



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*Nearby restaurants/places to eat*

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Lou Pinatu-3 miles from Cosycamp-5 stars

Le Sharks-2 miles from Cosycamp-4.5 stars

Le Comptoir de Nos Peres-2 miles from Cosycamp-4.5 stars

Eden Rock Café-2 miles from Cosycamp-4.5 stars

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*What would you do?*

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As I have already mentioned there are various swimming pools. As well as this, you could go swimming in the River Loire or hire a canoe provided by the campsite. Along with this there is also a Zipwire course in the trees with multiple zipwires going over the River. There are castle ruins nearby called Chateau d'artias that are within walking distance from Cosycamp.



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*What will the weather be like?*

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Overall, the weather in summer (July, August) will be warm in Southern Auvergne, so you should mainly pack cooler clothes such as t-shirts and shorts. However the evenings will get colder, so you should bring a couple of warmer clothes, especially if your camping in your own tent.
