children home themselves, and in this case one of the following steps will be taken:

- Use of a vehicle with a bulkhead (i.e. the driver is in a separate compartment to any passengers); or
- The driver and passenger will maintain a distance of 2m from each other; or
- The driver will use PPE (the same PPE as when supervising a symptomatic student, as explained above) and the passenger will wear a face mask if they are old enough and able to do so

A deep clean will take place in the areas that the symptomatic person has been in, and PPE will be disposed of properly, following decontamination guidance.

If the school becomes aware that a student or a staff member has tested positive for coronavirus, the school will contact the <u>local health protection team</u>. The team will carry out a rapid risk assessment to confirm who's been in close contact with the person, and these people will be asked to self-isolate.

To help with this, records will be kept of:

- The students and staff in each group
- Any close contact that takes place between children and staff in different groups

Close contact means:

- Direct close contact face-to-face contact with an infected person for any length of time, within 1 metre, including:
 - o Being coughed on,
 - A face-to-face conversation, or
 - Unprotected physical contact (skin-to-skin)

We have had to reduce the amount of time that students spend moving around the school; therefore, students in each bubble will remain in the same group of classrooms for the majority of their lessons, with teachers moving to different classrooms to deliver lessons. Priority for specialist rooms will go to KS4 and KS5 students. Rooms need to be cleaned if another bubble uses it, hence why movement between classes has been restricted. Each bubble will be given an individual outside space for break and lunchtimes as well as having the use of their bubble classrooms. All rooms will be cleaned at the end of every day and a number will be cleaned during the day. Bubbles will primarily be based in the following rooms:

Year 7: 19, 20, 26, 27, 28, 29

Year 8: 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8

Year 9: 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 18

Year 10/11: 17, 21, 22, 23, 24, S2, S3, S4, S5, S7, S8 (with priority to specialist rooms e.g. Drama studio, music room, science labs)

Year 12/13: In the mansion (with priority to specialist rooms e.g. Drama studio, music room, science labs)

Years 7-9 will use some specialist rooms on a rotation over 2/3 weeks, although they will all be in specialist rooms for their technology lessons

Every student will be provided with a new teaching and learning toolkit. This will be a ziplock bag that contains a mini whiteboard, pen, eraser and coloured cards. We intend to add learning resources to this bag over time.

We will ensure that music lessons continue across the curriculum when we return in September, ensuring we fol the recommended guidance. Music lessons will not involve any sharing of equipment or instruments across year grou bubbles, singing in large groups, woodwind, brass instruments or cross year group ensembles and bands. Despite these changes and restrictions, we have ensured to a full and exciting music curriculum will continue. As we are adhering to the guidance, we will be unable to run any of extra-curricular groups at the beginning of term. We will review the situation throughout the term; it is likely that smaller string groups will be reintroduced first. Instrument music lessons will continue to be offered by Presdales but some of these lessons will be offered remotely in the first instance with students needing to complete these sessions using a device and google meet, and some will be possible person with social distancing and good ventilation in place. Our Practice rooms will not be available for students to us during the school day for the majority of students. They we be open to A Level Music students and peripatetic teacher. Students will be asked to wear their PE kit to school on the days that they have PE lessons. They will remain in their PI kits following the lesson. This will avoid the need to use changing rooms. For physical activity, contact sports will be avoided. Outdoor sports will be prioritised where possible large indoor spaces used where it is not.
