Parc de la Colline du Château, this translates as castle hill, there was once a

medieval castle here that was destroyed by Louis XIV in 1706. The hill still stands and at 93 metres above sea level, it offers glorious, panoramic views over the city. There is a waterfall, park and picnic area.





The Musée Matisse is a museum devoted to the artwork of Henri Matisse. It has one of the World's largest collections of his work from his artistic beginnings to his last works.

The forecast is sunny and includes lows of 21 and highs of 26 degrees centigrade with a gentle breeze, therefore, packing, high factor sun cream, a sunhat and a sun parasol would be necessary.



My typical souvenir from Nice would be colourful ceramics, such as, cups, bowls and plates which can be bought from the Old Town and at the market of Cours Saleya.
