YCH Services for Young People | Children's Services

In the summer of 2020, YCH Services for Young People conducted a survey with young people in Hertfordshire to identify and better understand young people's priorities and concerns across the county. The findings of this survey identified that crime was one of respondents' top five concerns.

Young people shared that they were concerned about the risk of becoming a victim of crime, as well as feeling generally unsafe within certain areas in their communities. Many also expressed a wish for a greater adult and/or police presence in some areas, to act as a deterrent to those committing acts of violence, crime or anti-social behaviour.

Further consultation has since taken place between young people and the East Herts Youth Strategy Group, a group of partners who either directly deliver services to young people, or who have a strategic responsibility for young people's services. Together, the group is working to join up service delivery and respond to young people's needs.

We collectively identified a need to better identify the specific areas which were causing these concerns for young people and, to this end, Hertfordshire Police have designed a bespoke Echo Survey to capture the voice of young people across East Herts. The survey asks three simple questions:

- How safe do you feel in the area where you live?
- Why do you feel that way?
- What could be done to make you feel safer?

Through these questions, Hertfordshire Police hope to better understand the links between actual crime and the perceived risk of crime, as well as using the findings to inform the joint planning, delivery and allocation of resources by all partners within the East Herts Youth Strategy Group.

The greater the number of young people who complete the survey, the more that our partners will be able to understand specific geographic areas of concern, as well as the risk factors that are causing young people to feel unsafe. As such, I would like to encourage as many young people to complete the survey as possible. www.bit.ly/eherts-youth
