This week was 'The Global Week of Languages and Culture'. We celebrated the variety of languages and cultures represented in our diverse school community during a week of activities. In language lessons, Year 7 - 9 have researched cultural aspects of the languages they are learning and produced bunting to show what they have learned. Students in many lessons have been greeted in different languages by their teachers. Food has been a very important part of the week. The school canteen has offered meals with an international flavour, Year 7 have ordered an ice cream in a foreign language, either one they have learnt or in their home language. The highlight has to be the 'Culinary Connections' activity on Monday, when over 50 of our students brought in food made at home representing their home, heritage cultures from Ghana, Lithuania, France and many, many more. # Host a Teacher from Germany Programme - UK German Connection

It has been a delight to welcome Mrs Rabea Schorn, a qualified teacher from the Heinrich Heine Gesamtschule in Düsseldorf into our school community for the past two weeks. The 'Host a Teacher from Germany' programme is co-funded by the Department of Education (England) and coordinated by UK-German Connection in partnership with the Pädagogischer Austauschdienst (PAD). The PAD is the German governmental institution in charge of international exchange at school level and works to develop and promote international cooperation. Although Mrs Schorn has been mostly with the MFL Department, sharing authentic insights into German culture and language with our students, she has also been experiencing the British school system and life at Presdales.

#### **Super Curriculum**
