The Level 3 Teaching Assistant standard apprenticeship equips learners with the knowledge, skills, and behaviours to support the teacher and enhance pupils' learning in the classroom.

It is an idea pathway if you are:

- Looking for a long-term career in an educational setting.
- · Working as a Teaching Assistant, to upskill to further develop your knowledge and skills.
- Have a desire to improve the lives of others.
- Motivated and committed to your own development.
- Looking for a stepping stone into teaching.

- · How to support the class teacher to enhance the progress and achievements of pupils.
- Behaviour support strategies in the classroom.
- How to deliver individual and small group learning activities and interventions.
- Understand safeguarding policies and processes.
- Strategies to support pupils of different abilities.

LEVEL 3 TEACHING ASSISTANT

Course content will include:

- Supporting pupils to learn, progress and thrive.
- The importance of feedback in promoting independent learners.
- Practical strategies, to support teaching, learning and behaviour.
- The National Curriculum and effective assessment practice.
- Effective communication to support the needs of children.

How will you be assessed?

- Submission of a portfolio of evidence that is collated with written assignments, case studies and presentations.
- Practical observations.
- Professional discussion.
- Demonstration of competence during an End Point Assessment (EPA).

How long does this apprenticeship course take to complete?

Typically the course lasts between 13 to 15 months.

What are the entry requirements?

Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, plus a willingness to learn.

Desired qualifications

- Grace C or above or 4/5 (New Grading) At GCSE In Maths
- Grace C or above or 4/5 (New Grading) At GCSE In English

How is this course delivered?

- Discover new knowledge in live, interactive virtual sessions, led by qualified teachers.
- Engage in live and virtual Central Training days led by tutors and other professionals to support with strategies within the classroom.
- Collaboration with other apprentices working in similar environments throughout the programme.
- Virtual masterclasses, delivered by SEND specialists, educational psychologists, and other professionals.
- Regular progress reviews with both your employer and tutor.
- In-person tutor visits.

- Employed within a school as a Teaching Assistant.
- Foundation degree in Learning and Teaching with a pathway into teaching.
- Higher/Further Education.
- Transferrable employability skills relevant to public and emergency services.
