What is an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships are a great way to get into the world of work. An Apprenticeship is a real job with training and can launch your career, allow you to start earning and gain you a nationally recognised qualification. You will gain invaluable experience of working in a professional environment with the benefits of formal training. Typically, you will spend four days in the workplace and one day at college, depending on the needs of your employer.

An Apprenticeship can be a route to university level qualifications. You usually start at Level 2 or Level 3 and you can then progress to a Higher Apprenticeship at Level 4, or go on to study for part-time degree level qualifications such as HNCs, HNDs and Foundation Degrees.

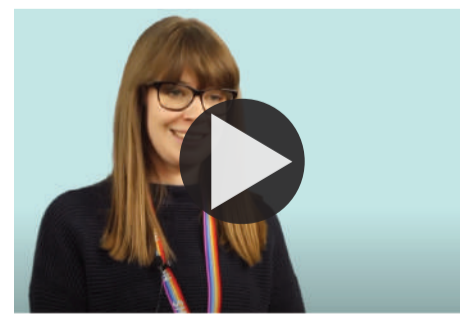
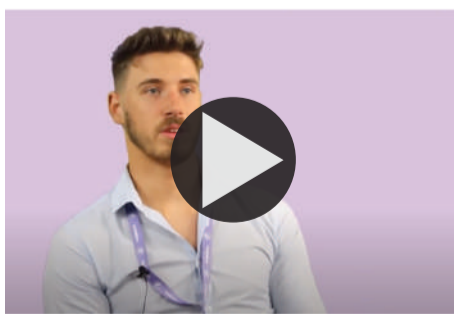
Meet our apprentices at Stansted Airport College:
