Year 9 Italian Curriculum Map



In Year 9 you will learn the language (vocabulary and grammar) by developing listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in the topic areas listed below. You will also revisit the SSCs (Sound Symbol Correspondence) when practising phonics. As part of the course, your knowledge of the cultural life in Italy will give you a better understanding of how people live there.



You will be working towards being able to complete the following skills:

- In Listening & Reading: Understanding key classroom commands, recognising the present, perfect and future tenses, understanding longer passages containing opinions and justifications with both familiar and unfamiliar language from authentic sources.
- In Speaking & Writing: Responding to a range of questions including the present, perfect and future tenses, developing longer answers/sentences using connectives and time phrases and including descriptions, opinions and justifications.
- **Translation**: Translating familiar sentences and short paragraphs into both Italian and English.
- **Pronunciation**: Developing the accuracy of pronunciation and intonation.

You will explore the following key topics:

Where I live (describing house and town), giving and understanding directions, holidays, jobs and plans for the future

You will come across the following cultural aspects throughout the year:

- Italian towns and cities
- Italian food and drink
- Italian festivals
- Film: Bianca come il latte, rosso come il sangue

You will practise the following grammar points throughout the year:

- Nouns & articles
- Adjectives and adjective endings
- Present tense verbs
- Mi piacerebbe / vorrei + infinitive.
- Perfect (past) tense
- Future tense
- Prepositions
