Top 200 Schools for Sports

We are thrilled to announce that Presdales has been named in the top 200 Sports Schools in the country by School Sports Magazine. For selection into the top 200, schools usually must reach the later stages of at least two, three or four National Competitions. The list covers up to 20 sports and more than 120 competitions. Reaching the top 200 puts Presdales in the top 4% of England's state and independent sporting schools. It is a huge achievement to feature alongside some of the most prestigious teaching establishments in the country.

This recognition reflects the unwavering commitment demonstrated by our PE staff, students and parents, towards PE and sport at Presdales.

Social Media Ban for Under 16s

Today, our Year 10, 11, and 12 students took part in a roundtable discussion with our local MP, Josh Dean. As one of the youngest members of Parliament and part of the first generation to "grow up" with social media, Mr Dean visited us to gather direct feedback for the Government's ongoing National Consultation on youth digital safety.

The Government is currently considering a legal ban on social media for those under 16 — a move that has already been implemented in Australia. Our students had strong feelings on this, and the level of confidence and maturity displayed by our students during the roundtable was nothing short of exceptional. Rather than providing surface-level reactions, they offered thoughtful and intelligent critiques of the current digital landscape, dissecting the psychological impact of algorithms and the complexities of legislative bans with remarkable clarity.

Mr Dean was impressed by the maturity of the debate and promised to take these insights back to the House of Commons.
